Tutor Qualifications:

- 1) Must be a junior, senior, or graduate level UL Lafayette college student. Sophomore status and/or non-UL students must meet with the Tutor Coordinator or the Director of the Student-Athlete Academic Center for initial consideration.
- 2) Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- 3) Must have earned an "A" or "B" in the course for which you state you can tutor. This will be verified by review of your transcript.
- 4) Must speak fluent English.
- 5) Must have the ability to work in one-on-one and group sessions.
- 6) Must be able to effectively deliver tutorial sessions in a way that caters toward student-athletes' learning styles.
- 7) Must complete reports in a timely manner.
- 8) Must be available to work within the following time frame:

Sundays: 6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Mondays-Thursdays: 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m.

Fridays: 8:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

Tutor Information:

- 1) Pay rate is \$8.00/hour.
- 2) You are not guaranteed any set number of work hours. The number of hours you work is dependent upon the tutoring needs of our student-athletes. Your availability and your ability to tutor will contribute to the number of hours you are assigned. Our program is appointment based and relies upon the student-athlete requesting tutoring assistance.
- 3) You will be required to attend a training session upon hiring along with at least 1 training session during the semester.
